The Association of Geohazard Professionals Announce 2022 Rope Access Safety Recognition Recipients

This program, honoring best-in-class safety development and implementation initiatives within the geohazard industry, distinguishes companies that foster and employ safe rope access work procedures, provide education and training to their personnel, and commit to enhancing the safety culture within their organizations. Criteria for consideration include:

- lowest Total Incident Rates rate
- lowest Days Away and Restricted duty/job Transfer (DART) case rate
- minimum combined 85-point score in leading and trailing safety indicator categories

Each applicant's safety program and performance metrics were reviewed, including Total Incident Rates and Lost Time/Modified Duty Rates statistics. Additionally, management involvement and commitment to the firm's safety program, written rope access safety procedures, and adherence to industry best practices were reviewed.

"The AGHP's Rope Access Safety Recognition has continued to grow with 15 recipients for the 2022 program. This yearly growth shows that industry leaders in geohazard mitigation are taking rope access safety seriously and are proud of their efforts to keep their workers safe.
